

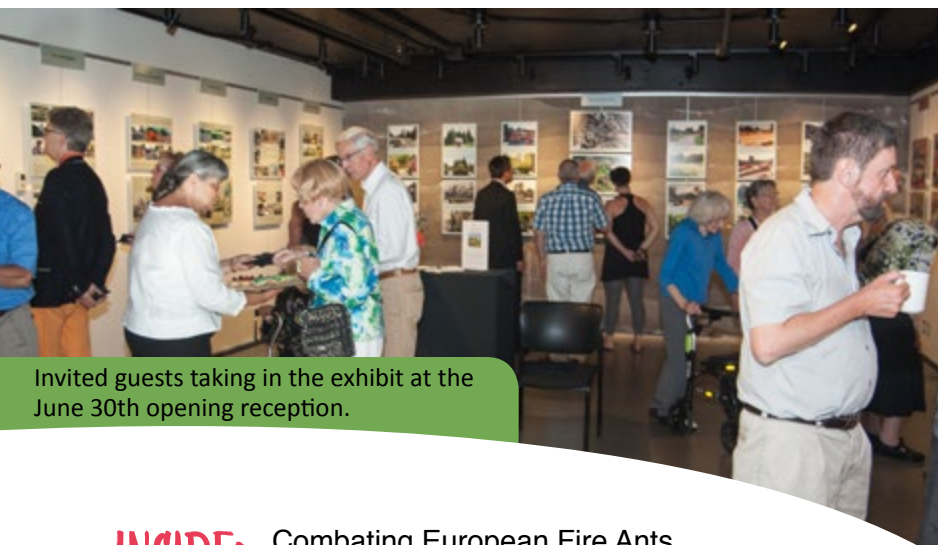
# 40<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY

On August 30, 2015, VanDusen Botanical Garden officially turned 40 years old. The story of how the Garden came to be, the personalities involved, and the evolution of the Garden over time were celebrated twice this past summer.

The first was the official launch of *Celebrating 40 Years: a photo retrospective* on June 30th. Organized and coordinated by volunteers and staff of the VBGA, and funded by the McGrane-Pearson Endowment Fund, this exhibit features more than 800 curated photographs (and supporting text) that document the history of the Garden from its time as the Shaugnessy Golf Course to present day. Visitors are encouraged to see this remarkable showcase of the Garden in the Discovery Room of the Visitor Centre until September 20, 2015.

The second celebration was organized by Park Board on August 16th. Thousands of people came out to the Garden to celebrate its 40th birthday. Activities included a photo booth, climbing wall, fairy post office, tattoo stations, historical and botanical talks and tours, a putting green, and education activities for families. There was music, food and an opportunity to hear from some of the original founders of the Garden.

The history of the Garden is one of collaboration and shared passion for all things horticultural. If the participation and enthusiasm of visitors and supporters at these events is anything to go by, the future of the Garden will be more of the same. 🍀

## STRATEGIC INVESTMENT: INVASIVE SPECIES TECHNICIAN

The VanDusen Botanical Garden Association and City of Vancouver Park Board agreed to jointly fund a position – for a full year – to help combat the spread of European Fire Ants in the Garden. Lisa Wong has been our Invasive Species Technician since the beginning of January this year. Our editor recently interviewed Lisa.

### What is an Invasive Species Technician?

My job is to constantly explore the Garden to find where European Fire Ants (EFA) might be living and to destroy their nests. I report to Cynthia Sayre, the Garden Curator, and work with her to develop strategies and approaches to beating back the ant population. Together, we also work closely with the gardeners to keep the Garden as free of ants as we can.

### What happens when you find them?

I look for signs of ants. I follow them until I can find their nest(s). And then I basically dig them out and spray them with *AntOut*®. Sometimes

I have to do this several times at one site. I've also been using flags to mark where nests have been found and treated so that I can easily go back to see if I've actually gotten them all.

### What is "Ant out"?

To safeguard the health of the Garden, the Vancouver Park Board is applying *AntOut*®. It contains permethrin, a synthetic form of the natural insecticide pyrethrum found in chrysanthemums.

### How many nests have you found this year so far?

It's really hard to say. But definitely a lot.

### Are we making progress in controlling this species in the Garden?

Overall, I would say yes. In the areas I've been treating ... when I go back, I find a fraction of what was there before and other areas where we've definitely gotten rid of them altogether. But there are some areas, like the Alma VanDusen Meadow, where the scale of infestation is so big that it is almost impossible to even make a dent.

### What is the biggest "aha" moment of the past year for you?

That our practices and approaches here are being watched by others and are being shared around by researchers and city staff. It feels good to know that we are making progress managing the ants in the Garden and helping others make progress elsewhere. 🍀

## KIDS + SUMMER + VANDUSEN = A WHOLE LOT OF FUN AND LEARNING

What a summer it's been! VanDusen's summer camp program took a leap of faith this year with the decision to double the opportunities for kids to explore, learn and play in the Garden. Clearly it was the right move, as all 16 camps have been full, with several camps completely selling out within 10 minutes of being announced. How lucky we are that our fundamental values regarding the importance of outdoor, hands-on learning are shared by the Vancouver community. Our campers come from a diversity of families, many of whom are first-time visitors to the Garden, and often become members as a result of this experience.

This summer, over 300 children have spent a week at the Garden to explore connections between plants, people, insects, birds, food, and art. They created ephemeral earth art, released ladybugs, planted and harvested vegetables, identified insects in the ponds, learned bird watching, planted cuttings in the greenhouse, and explored every inch of the Garden. They learned about a "Tree of the Day", "Artist of the Day", or "Bird of the Day", and discovered Cedars, Ginkgos, Oaks, Monet, Goldsworthy, Van Gogh, herons, owls, or woodpeckers. Our new traveling camp, "Bogs to Beaches", took older campers to explore Camosun Bog, Lynn Canyon, Stanley Park, Bloedel Conservatory, and other interesting sites around the city.

Running this many camps came with several challenges, including the need for a second location to call home base. The underused glasshouse between the herb and rose gardens seemed the perfect solution, but it required significant upgrades. So we made the financial commitment to the project and jumped into the challenge. We replaced the leaking glass roof, removed an interior rock wall, poured a concrete countertop around a new sink, repainted the floor, and purchased kid-appropriate furnishings. The result? A beautiful new space absolutely perfect for camp, right in the Garden. The kids love it, as do the many visitors that peek in to see what is going on.

So, now that we have this marvelous new space, what else can we do here? Half of the year it will be occupied by Festival of Lights preparation, and perhaps Santa. At other times, the opportunities are vast, and the ideas aplenty. Perhaps a "Young Sprouts" program for preschool aged children, birthday parties, yoga classes, or horticultural therapy programs. Messy classes on plant propagation or container planting. The possibilities are exciting, but they will need planning, and financial support. We welcome your involvement and look forward to exploring new potential together. 🍀
