Visual Arts

Big Ideas

- Grade 3
 - Creative experiences involve and interplay between exploration and inquiry
 - The arts connect out experiences to the experiences of others
- Grade 4
 - Creative expression is a means to explore and share one's identity within a community
 - Exploring works of art exposes us to diverse values, knowledge, and perspectives
- Grade 5
 - Artists experiment in a variety of ways to discover new possibilities and perspectives
 - Works of art influence and are influenced by the world around us
- Grade 6
 - Engaging in creative expression and experiences expands people's sense of identity and community
 - o Artistic expressions differ across time and place
- Grade 7
 - Experiencing art challenges our point of view and expands our understanding of others
 - Engaging in the arts develops people's ability to understand and express complex ideas

Curricular Competencies

 - o (Grades 3-6) Create artistic works using imagination, inquiry, and purposeful play

- o Apply learned skills, understandings, and processes in new contexts

- Describe and respond to visual art pieces, provide constructive feedback, explore artists' intent
- o Experience and document creative works in a variety of ways

Content

- Visual arts: elements of design: line, shape, space, texture, colour, form; principles of design: pattern, repetition, balance, rhythm, unity, variety, contrast, emphasis, harmony
- Processes, materials, movements, technologies, tools and techniques
- Symbolism as ways of creating and representing meaning
- Symbolism and metaphor to explore ideas and perspective
- Traditional Aboriginal arts and arts-making processes
- A variety of **local, regional and national works of art** and artistic traditions from diverse cultures, communities, times and places
- Personal and collective responsibility associated with creating and experiencing in a safe learning environment
