Artist Demos

Patricia Banks

Best known for her detailed oil and acrylic paintings, Patricia travels widely and is inspired by the splendor of the natural environment. She has exhibited across North America, and has won several awards for her work

Cherie Sibley Wasyliw




Joyce Trygg

360° Nature Art Walk



This year, in response to a need to expand virtual programming due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a 360 virtual nature art walk was produced, based in North Vancouver's Maplewood Flats Conservancy area. The "proof-of-concept" virtual walk features the art of local chapter members of Artists for Conservation. Most photos on the tour were taken in August, 2020, during the peak of the forest fires across western North America. Smoke originating hundreds of miles to the south of North Vancouver shrouded the area and resulted in ghostly light effects during the day.

The exhibit features the art by local members of Artists for Conservation, including: Patricia Banks, Bryan Coombes, Rob Butler, Vicky Earle, James Harry, Mark Hobson, Joseph Koensgen, Laura Levitsky, Anita McComas, Ken Nash, Dorset Norwich-Young, Ashley Roll, Ronald Straight and Joyce Trygg.

The tour was produced in partnership with the Wild Bird Trust of BC, and with the support of the North Vancouver Recreation & Culture Commission, the City and District of North Vancouver, BC Arts Council and Heritage Canada.
